ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENT

The P5100 Radios were purchased in June, 2005 and only have the capability to work with the Sheriff's 800 System. These upgrade radios will have the ability to work on 700 and 800 MHz systems and ability to have direct communications with the State system(s).

The trade-in value per unit is equal to the original price for the first 30 units and the mobile unit that were never used and the purchase price less \$169.55 for the 38 units that were programmed for use.

The Finance Department recommends this resolution for adoption.
