Hurricane Ida (2021 TW IDA 21-018)	Allocate additional funds for Hurricane Ida related expenditures, including pre-storm mitigation measures and maintenance; emergency operations and assessment; activation of shelters and transit; debris push, pickup, disposal, and monitoring; utility services such as sewerage pumping, sludge hauling and disposal; and equipment repairs and replacement. Administration intends to seek assistance for the expenditures. Federal funding is 100% for debris removal and emergency protective measures, including direct Federal assistance, for 45 days from the start of the incident period. In addition, the Federal share for all categories of Public Assistance, including direct Federal assistance, is 90% of the total eligible costs, except for assistance previously authorized at 100 percent.
